## **About the Orthopaedic PAC**

- Formed in 1999 to help advance the legislative agenda of the AAOS and subspecialty groups
- Mission of OrthoPac:
  - direct lobbying
  - educational campaigns
  - grassroots advocacy
  - social media
- OrthoPAC is the vehicle that opens political doors, allowing AAOS a seat at the table
- Today, it is among the largest Association PACs in the United States and the largest physician PAC (larger than the AMA) in the country




## Why is Advocacy Important?

Current conditions demand that the AAOS take an active role in advocacy

Discussions with Congress and federal regulators ensure that issues affecting orthopaedic surgeons and their patients are heard

Continuous communication from AAOS fellows and staff allows for orthopaedic surgeons to have a seat at the policy table

# PAC Support: Transparent and Member-Led Process

PAC Members can request contributions for physician-friendly candidates

- We receive feedback from stakeholders in state societies
- All potential candidates fill out questionnaire on our issues
  - New: added questions on bipartisanship and core values
- PAC Executive Committee votes on financial support from the OrthoPAC
- Transparency: We publish all our contributions in the AAOS Annual Report. They are reported monthly to the Federal Election Commission.




Active participation in the political process is essential to our long-term success. PACs are a key source of funding for Congressional elections. In the 2022 election, PACs donated a total of \$465 million to candidates alone. And this funding plays a key role in determining the outcome of elections.

## How was AAOS OrthoPAC impactful in the 2022 Election Cycle?

- Raised \$3,267,069 (hard + soft dollars) in the 2022 Election Cycle from
- **3,670** AAOS Members
- Bipartisan Giving- 50% Republican 50% Democrat
- Helped Elect 2 New Physicians to Congress
- We raised \$1,019,927, during the 1<sup>st</sup> six months of 2023
  - 51% of our \$2,000,000 2023 Goal
  - 26% of our \$4,000,000 2024 Election Cycle Goal









## Mitigating Medicare Pay Cuts



Congress stopped short of preventing the full 4.5% reduction to 2023 Medicare Physician Fee Schedule payments. There will be an approximate 2% payment reduction in 2023 and at least an additional 1.25% in 2024.

## Reforming Prior Authorization



The Improving Seniors' Timely
Access to Care Act of 2021
unanimously passed the
House in September 2022.
Worked with over 258 cosponsors of the Improving
Seniors Timely Access to Care
Act. This bill did not pass the
Senate. (CBO)

## Reducing Physician Burn Out



The **Dr. Lorna Breen Health Care Provider Protection Act of 2022** was signed into law
in March 2022.

## Physician Owned Hospitals



Secured 38 co-sponsors in the House and 11 in the Senate for the Patient Access to Higher Quality Health Care Act of 2021.

This bill has been re-introduced in the 118th Congress.

## 117th Congress Accomplishments

### No Surprises Act Implementation



Sent letters to the administration requesting oversight hearings to address problems with implementing the No Surprises Act.

#### Telemedicine



Major telehealth flexibilities extended for 151 days after conclusion of PHE to ensure that Medicare beneficiaries retain access to telemedicine.

### Peer Reviewed Orthopaedic Research Program (PRORP)



\$30 million appropriated for PRORP, a competitive grant program that strives to address the most significant research gaps for military personnel with orthopaedic injuries.




- Proposed rule mirrors legislation in many ways
- Letter from over 300 members of Congress to finalize proposed rule
- Legislation stalled until proposed rule is final
- Referred to Committee on Ways and Means and Energy and Commerce July 27, 2023

## Physician Owned Hospitals POH H.R. 977 / S. 470

- AAOS Urging Congress to Repeal Ban on Physician-Owned Hospital Expansion.
- Senator James Lankford (R-OK), Representative Michael Burgess, MD (R-TX) and colleagues in support of their newly introduced Patient Access to Higher Quality Health Care Act



### **The SAVE Act would:**

- Establish federal, criminal penalties for those who knowingly assault or intimidate hospital employees or those contracted by a hospital
- Authorize \$25 million in grant funding over 10 years to reduce violence and intimidation in hospitals

### Why the SAVE Act matters:

- Since 2022, two orthopaedic surgeons have been tragically killed in incidents involving patients
- Threats of workplace violence or actual violence against health care workers can make it difficult for physicians to continue to provide quality patient care and lead to physician burnout.

- Introduced by Reps. Larry Bucshon, MD (R-IN-8) and Madeline Dean (D-PA) April 18, 2023. 16 cosponsors
- Introduced by Joe Machin D-(WV)-Senate- September 12, 2023



### AAOS Congressional Ambassador Program

- Administered by Board of Councilors Advocacy Resources Committee (ARC)
- Seeks to pair all 535 members of Congress with at least one AAOS Fellow, based on existing or newly created relationships
- Seeks to utilize established relationships to influence the legislative process in favor of AAOS legislative priorities, as defined by the AAOS Council on Advocacy







## Board of Councilors Committee on State Legislative & Regulatory Issues (SLRI)

- Administer and monitor the effectiveness of the State Orthopaedic Society Health Policy Action Fund (HPAF) to assist state societies in dealing with state legislative and regulatory issues
- Provide state orthopaedic societies with ideas for strengthening their health policy capabilities
- Develop strategies for the AAOS and state orthopaedic societies to effectively address state health policy issues

The State Orthopaedic Society HPAF has allocated more than **\$1.5 million** in grants to support state advocacy efforts in the last ten years.

Currently, applications are considered twice per year – once during the AAOS Annual Meeting and during the National Orthopaedic Leadership Conference
